

# Berryessa Citizens Advisory Council Meeting Minutes



March 14, 2016 Location: Berryessa Community Center

#### **General Meeting Minutes**

- 1. Meeting called to Order at 7:14p.m. By President Linda Locke.
- 2. <u>Welcome of First Time Attendees</u>
  -Linda Locke welcomed and introduced all the notables and first time attendees in the audience. We had one new resident in attendance.
- 3. <u>Approval of last months' General Meeting Minutes</u>
  -Will Ector presented the minutes from the February General Meeting.
  Minutes were approved.
- 4. <u>Treasurers Report</u>
  Marlou Bitcon gave an updated budget report. Current balance is \$2,025.38
  -Treasurers Report was approved. 58 members were present.
- 5. Police Report Captain Anthony Mata, San Jose Police Department
  -Officer Mata gave a report on the crime report in area William that is part of the
  Foothill Division. He introduced Sargent Paul Cook is new to the Division with the new shift
  change effective yesterday. Stats for District William: 16 violent crimes up form 10 in
  January. William is broken into two sections #1 and #2. Section #1 Had 1 robbery
  reported; Section #2 south of Penitencia creek had four violent crimes reported.
  William Had 98 property crimes, which is high. 32 stolen vehicles and 52 Thefts, 14
  residential burglaries

Officers arrested 40 people for the month on a variety of charges. Wrote 29 citations for moving violations and 26 for non-moving violations.

Captain Mata said he has met with some of the principals of our schools to help them educate students on how to be safe.

He has authorized overtime for his officers to provide higher visibility in the communities where the crime rate is high. He has prioritized focusing in on gang areas. He mentioned the challenge of recruiting new officers due to the retirement issue the department is undergoing. He stated the city is working with the police department on the type of stops police make on a daily basis. A consultant has been awarded the grant to monitor the department and its stops.

6. Neighborhood Commission Report - Linda Locke

Had a meeting last week. There will be an election in May for the new Neighborhood Commission representatives for District 4.

- -Mario Lopez aide to Supervisor Dave Cortese introduced Sheriff Deputy Alexandria Ridgeway to the membership. She will be visiting with us at future meetings. She brought in some statistics for our area called Edward 1. She patrols the unincorporated area on Sierra Road, Sunset Road.
- -<u>Linda Locke</u> announced that our City Councilman Manh Nguyen recognized the BCAC as a Community Hero for District 4. She also introduced the Berryessa Education Foundation fundraiser would be held on Saturday, March 19<sup>th</sup>, 2016, from 11am to 1pm.
