





INFORMATION

This memorandum provides the City Council with information on planned locations for pavement maintenance work on City streets during calendar year 2019.

BACKGROUND

For the first time in recent history, the Pavement Maintenance Program is fully funded for the upcoming construction season. In fact, with two notable outcomes from the November election and the prospect of a favorable resolution to the VTA 2016 Measure B lawsuit on the horizon, the City's Pavement Maintenance Program should be fully funded for at least the next six years based on funding need projections performed in early 2018.

In the November election, California's gas tax increase known as Senate Bill 1 withstood a repeal effort and will continue to provide the City with an estimated \$17.5 million in annual pavement maintenance funds that will be programmed for use on the City's major streets in 2019. Additionally, San José voters approved Measure T, the Disaster Preparedness, Public Safety, and Infrastructure Bond Measure, which will provide \$300 million to repair an estimated 388 miles of local and neighborhood streets in the worst condition starting in 2020.









