- Perimeter ~260 ft
- No Existing Features
- Only Water Source For Irrigation Is The SCVWD-Owned Sprinkler System At The Fence Line
- 3x8 ft PRNS Approved Benches (DuMor)
 - ADA Compliant Concert Footers
 - Center Arm Rest
- Commemorative Plaque
- Trash Receptacle
- 1 Bike Rack

- Objectives Create a Pocket Forest and Rest Spot Across the Path From the Scheduled Dog Park
- Scope
 - ► Plan,
 - Coordinate,
 - Secure Sponsorships,
 - Obtain Approvals, and
 - Coordinate Among Government Offices
- Collaborative Engagement with the San José 1,000 Trees Project and Our City Forest
- \$10,000 District #4 Grant as Seed Money



Charter Item #2 - Pond Enhancement - Dog Park Extension & Preliminary Numbers



- Area ~1.5 Acres
- Perimeter ~354 ft
- San José PRNS Has Irrigation Water Access
- Preliminary Site of a District #04 Pocket Forest
- Would Complement the PRNS Plans
 - Benches, Trash Receptacle, Bike Rack
 - Trees, Grasses, and Vegitation

Charter Item #3 – Take Stands On Issues Affecting Our Community

- 2010 Successful Redistricting Effort
 - From 2 to 1 US House District
 - From 4 to 1 California Assembly District
 - From 2 to 1 State Senate District
- 2017 Successfully Opposed Siting the Bridge Housing at the Property on Noble
- 2021 Unsuccessfully Opposed "Opportunity Housing" Removal of Single-Family Zoning Protection – State Law Usurped Local Authority
